FOREWORD

We proudly present Auction 103, an exceptional sale of 488 lots of rare and historic banknotes, fiscal documents, and financial ephemera. This sale is especially distinguished by an outstanding selection of early U.S. 1864 Interest Bearing Notes and an extraordinary pair of ca.1837 Louisiana Interest Bearing Post Notes—offered publicly for the very first time.

Among the many highlights is a trio of rare 1864 U.S. Interest Bearing Treasury issues, including the iconic \$50 and \$100 Compound Interest Treasury Notes, and a \$50 Interest Bearing Note, with only 6 known of this type —all of these notes are rarely seen at auction, usually individually, with this being a rare occasion that all three will be available in one venue. These notes were designed as financial instruments to help fund the Civil War effort and remain among the most historically important and visually complex notes ever issued by the U.S. Treasury.

Adding to this prestigious group are two recently discovered Post Notes from the Citizens Bank of Louisiana, including a \$100 and a \$500 denomination, circa 1837. These discovery pieces—graded PMG VF 25 and Choice XF 45 respectively—are the earliest known Louisiana bearer Post Notes to explicitly bear interest. Their emergence offers collectors a rare glimpse into the financial mechanisms of antebellum Southern banking, and their inclusion marks a notable auction debut.

In addition, this auction features a standout selection of U.S. rarities, beginning with an 1882 \$5 National Bank of Kentucky of Louisville, Ch# 5312 S, Fr#537, graded PCGS Superb Gem Unc 67 PPQ—one of the finest known for the bank. A 1914 \$10 Federal Reserve Note Red Seal from the Atlanta District, Fr#897A, graded PCGS Choice Unc 63 with the coveted low serial number F2A. A major highlight includes a remarkable Series of 1928A Richmond District \$10/\$5 Dual Denomination Error, Fr#2001-E, PMG graded Choice About Unc 58, representing one of the rarest and most dramatic U.S. printing errors known, with only about ten recorded. Other highlights include an 1861 \$1 Bank of Fayette County, Uniontown, Pennsylvania note with Serial Number 1, graded PMG Gem Unc 65 EPQ, and a 1912 Dominion of Canada \$5, DC-21c, graded PMG Gem Unc 65 EPQ. The sale also includes a strong selection of world banknotes, U.S. Colonials, Obsoletes, Depression-era currency, security printing ephemera, and U.S. and World Scripophily. We welcome your participation in this diverse and historically significant offering. Whether you're seeking iconic rarities or exploring overlooked segments of fiscal history, Auction 103 promises a compelling collecting opportunity.



KEY TO CATALOGING

DEFINITIONS

SPECIMEN: An archival printing sample of a finished item, such as a stock certificate, banknote or stamp that is printed usually with "00000" serial numbers and may have "Specimen" overprinted on it and be punch canceled to invalidate it and prevent its use surreptitiously. Specimens were kept for a number of reasons, though usually as samples to give out to prospective customers to give them an idea of the type and quality of the work that the printing company was capable of doing. Usually specimens were printed in limited amounts at the beginning of a printing run to evaluate the quality of the printing work and color combinations at an early stage, rather than have an entire production run rejected due to some minor flaw that was not found until after the printing was completed. A specimen is similar to the final product, printed on the same paper and in the same color.

COLOR TRIAL SPECIMENS: Sometimes specimens would be printed in numerous color combinations not used on the final note for evaluation before a final printing. These are usually extremely rare.

PROOF: An initial pull or impression from a plate or die for evaluation of text, vignette, engraving, and esthetic appeal and to check for any errors or faults. These were usually printed on india paper mounted on card or printed on some form of paper or light card. The amount of proofs printed is usually extremely small and usually number only a handful. Proofs allowed the printing company to evaluate the quality of the item being printed without having to go to the expense of making final plates and finding out small errors that could have been repaired at an earlier stage. Usually, proofs are single impressions of banknotes, stamps, vignettes, etc. Anything that was made into a plate, such as a sheet of 100 stamps could have had proof impressions taken from it. These would be called plate proofs (for multiple images) versus die proofs (usually of a single or small amount of images).

COLOR TRIAL PROOF: A proof printed in a color other than the issued color.

ESSAY SPECIMEN or PROOF: A proposed design that was not used but may be similar or even totally different to a final approved design. An artist, engraver or company may have proposed a number of different designs and color combinations to a client for his approval. If a design is rejected and never used, it could be called an essay.

PRODUCTION MATERIAL: Material found in files used in the production of security printed documents, banknotes, stamps and such. It may include correspondence, photographs, artwork, and signature samples, samples of other printed items that are marked up with corrections as well as proofs, specimens, essays, models, mockups and issued final items.

MODEL: A proposed or final design that may include original artwork, pieces of design elements such as borders, titles, vignettes, corporate seals, undertints and possibly portions of photographs. Before an engraved item was made, a design had to be decided on. This portion of the design process allowed for the artistic skills of the engraver or design department to be exhibited. Before the" digital age", banknote engravers and designers would cut up portions of other engraved items and re-apply them in a different form or design to come up with a unique new stamp, banknote or certificate. Often, all new engravings or "vignettes" of people or scenes would be engraved first to include in the new "work of art", and other times, portions of different completed items would be "borrowed" to use on a newly designed item. All models are rare and almost all of them are unique.

Washington Hunt takes a grim view of the Canal Convention, stating that it is his belief that "they will propose things which the General Government has neither the financial ability or the Constitutional power to perform." He continues to write, "We have just finished the Erie Canal enlargement, it will be found sufficient for the trade in some years to come...The Canal is...the property of New York and we cannot allow other states to have any partnership in it even by implication. Let us have something that we can call our own, untouched by Federal interference." This document highlights the different political perspectives between the two politicians, as Hunt admits that he took the liberty to make these suggestions to Governor Seymour. He is particularly concerned about New York State's rights, and ends the letter with a plead to not "reduce the State to a mere satellite of the central government." Washington Hunt (August 5, 1811 - February 2, 1867) was an American lawyer and politician. In his last years, Hunt moved increasingly closer to the Democrats, endorsing his two-time opponent, Horatio Seymour for the New York gubernatorial race in 1862 and supporting George McClellan for the presidency at the 1864 Democratic National Convention, Horatio Seymour (May 31, 1810 - February 12, 1886) was an American politician. He served as Governor of New York from 1853 to 1854 and from 1863 to 1864. He was the Democratic Party nominee for president in the 1868 presidential election, won by Republican, General Ulysses S. Grant. Fascinating piece of history related to two political figures and New York Governors who opposed each other in elections more than once, but clearly had a communicative relationship.
