KEY TO CATALOGING

DEFINITIONS

SPECIMEN: An archival printing sample of a finished item, such as a stock certificate, banknote or stamp that is printed usually with "000000" serial numbers and may have "Specimen" overprinted on it and be punch canceled to invalidate it and prevent its use surreptitiously. Specimens were kept for a number of reasons, though usually as samples to give out to prospective customers to give them an idea of the type and quality of the work that the printing company was capable of doing. Usually specimens were printed in limited amounts at the beginning of a printing run to evaluate the quality of the printing work and color combinations at an early stage, rather than have an entire production run rejected due to some minor flaw that was not found until after the printing was completed. A specimen is similar to the final product, printed on the same paper and in the same color.

COLOR TRIAL SPECIMENS: Sometimes specimens would be printed in numerous color combinations not used on the final note for evaluation before a final printing. These are usually extremely rare.

PROOF: An initial pull or impression from a plate or die for evaluation of text, vignette, engraving, and esthetic appeal and to check for any errors or faults. These were usually printed on india paper mounted on card or printed on some form of paper or light card. The amount of proofs printed is usually extremely small and usually number only a handful. Proofs allowed the printing company to evaluate the quality of the item being printed without having to go to the expense of making final plates and finding out small errors that could have been repaired at an earlier stage. Usually, proofs are single impressions of banknotes, stamps, vignettes, etc. Anything that was made into a plate, such as a sheet of 100 stamps could have had proof impressions taken from it. These would be called plate proofs (for multiple images) versus die proofs (usually of a single or small amount of images).

COLOR TRIAL PROOF: A proof printed in a color other than the issued color.

ESSAY SPECIMEN or PROOF: A proposed design that was not used but may be similar or even totally different to a final approved design. An artist, engraver or company may have proposed a number of different designs and color combinations to a client for his approval. If a design is rejected and never used, it could be called an essay.

PRODUCTION MATERIAL: Material found in files used in the production of security printed documents, banknotes, stamps and such. It may include correspondence, photographs, artwork, and signature samples, samples of other printed items that are marked up with corrections as well as proofs, specimens, essays, models, mockups and issued final items.

MODEL: A proposed or final design that may include original artwork, pieces of design elements such as borders, titles, vignettes, corporate seals, undertints and possibly portions of photographs. Before an engraved item was made, a design had to be decided on. This portion of the design process allowed for the artistic skills of the engraver or design department to be exhibited. Before the" digital age", banknote engravers and designers would cut up portions of other engraved items and re-apply them in a different form or design to come up with a unique new stamp, banknote or certificate. Often, all new engravings or "vignettes" of people or scenes would be engraved first to include in the new "work of art", and other times, portions of different completed items would be "borrowed" to use on a newly designed item. All models are rare and almost all of them are unique.



Australia (Van Diemen's Land), Tasmania. Derwent Bank, 1836 Issued Cashier's Draft/Check, Campbell Town. Australia (Van Diemen's Land), 19 December 1836, Printed cashier's draft of the Derwent Bank, black on offwhite with vertical left guilloche panel inscribed "DERWENT BANK." Pre-printed location "Hobart Town" is struck through and corrected in manuscript to "Campbell Town;" filled out to "Mr. H. J. Emmett" for Eight pounds 4/6, payable "or order;" bold cashiers' imprint "CASHIER OF THE DERWENT BANK" at center; contemporary signatures at lower left and right; unobtrusive clerical notations. An attractive early Tasmanian banking form showing branch use outside Hobart with the imprint corrected in period ink. XF-AU Condition. The payee, Henry James Emmett (1782-1848), was a prominent early official and settler in Van Diemen's Land (Tasmania). Originally a clerk in the Colonial Secretary's office in Sydney, he was transferred to Hobart in 1814 where he held numerous government posts, including clerk to the Bench of Magistrates and Postmaster General. Despite later financial difficulties, Emmett remained a wellknown figure in colonial Tasmania. Documents payable to him, such as this 1836 draft, are sought after for their direct association with one of the island colony's early

An impressive example of the large-format Qing Dynasty Board of Revenue issue denominated 5 Taels, dated to the 7th year of Emperor Xianfeng (1857). Printed in black with extensive vermillion overprints, including large red seal stamps and character annotations. Central panel with detailed Chinese script surrounded by an elaborate blue border featuring traditional design motifs; large vertical text at right margin, denomination " " (Five Taels) prominently displayed. Serial number 42655. PMG graded Choice Very Fine 35, a desirable mid-grade survivor of these scarce Tael notes, which circulated during a turbulent period of the mid-19th century Taiping Rebellion. Despite their large size and fragile paper, this note retains strong detail and vibrant red seals, making it an exceptional representative of this historic early Chinese issue. This denomination was issued over a period of 5 years beginning in 1853. Only $\boldsymbol{1}$ example could be found having been offered at auction over the last 10 years and that was by Stacks Bowers in 2022, during the height of the China banknote and coin market, where it sold for \$14,000, with a lower grade designation of PMG 25. This example is extremely attractive example offers the appearance of a higher grade designation and will enhance any advanced collection. ..

Issuing notes such as these was only a temporary solution. Some of the signers include Fenn Wadsworth (1750/51-1785) was a brigade major to General James Wadsworth from 1776 to 1779. He fought in many battles during that time, but his failing health forced him to leave active service. Wadsworth stayed in Connecticut's government, as shown by his membership to the Pay-Table Committee; William Moseley (1755-1824) who later would serve in the Connecticut state senate, and was also the Director of the Hartford National Bank from 1797 to 1815; Jedediah (or Jedidiah) Huntington (4 August 1743 - 25 September 1818) was an American general in the Continental Army during the American Revolutionary War. After the war, he served in numerous civilian posts; and, Oliver Wolcott Jr. who was an American politician and judge. He was the second United States Secretary of the Treasury, a judge of the United States Circuit Court for the Second Circuit, and the 24th Governor of Connecticut. All are in VF condition. (3). After the passage of the National Banking Act, the bank reorganized in 1863 as Girard National Bank. The bank was acquired by Mellon Bank in 1983 and then, two







It was forced to divest its holding companies and reorganize due to the passage of the Public Utility Holding Company Act of 1935. Following the passage of the Act, the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) selected the largest of the U.S. holding companies, Ebasco to be the test case of the law before the U.S. Supreme Court. The court case known as Securities and Exchange Commission v. Electric Bond and Share company was settled in favor of the SEC on March 28th 1938. It took twenty-five years of legal action by the SEC to break up Ebasco and the other major U.S. electric holding companies until they conformed with the 1935 act. It was allowed to retain control of its foreign electric power holding company known as the American & Foreign Power Company (A&FP). After its reorganization, it became an investment company, but soon turned into a major designer and engineer of both fossil fuel and nuclear power electric generation facilities. Its involvement in the 1983 financial collapse of the Washington Public Power Supply System's five nuclear reactors led to Ebasco's demise because of the suspension of nuclear power orders and lawsuits that included numerous asbestos claims. The U.S. nuclear industry stopped all construction of new facilities following the 1979 nuclear meltdown at Three Mile Island, going into decline because of radiation safety concerns and major construction cost overruns...



In 1989, the Securities and Exchange Commission filed a civil action against Crazy Eddie founder Eddie Antar and a group of former executives, accusing them of manipulating the value of the company's stock by overstating profits and sales in financial reports. The complaint alleged that Antar, members of his family, and company executives engaged in securities fraud and insider trading from the time the company first went public in 1985 until 1989. Antar, the complaint charged, made over \$60 million from the conspiracy, selling off stock just before the real results of Crazy Eddie's evidently at best marginally profitable operations became public. In 1989 the chain suffered a major scandal when Eddie Antar and his family were accused (and eventually convicted) of "cooking the books" in order to skim money and inflate inventory. Antar was found to have sold used electronics as new, committed insurance fraud, faked inventory, and skimmed most of the cash payments to avoid taxes. Having taken the company public (the stock was soon worth hundreds of millions), Antar began selling his stock and the stock price began to collapse. The firm was bought in a hostile takeover by another company, but the buyers were quick to find that some \$80 million in inventory did not exist. Antar fled to Israel using the name David Cohen, where he lived until 1994 when he was extradited back to the United States. He was subsequently sentenced to eight years in jail, ordered to pay over \$150 million in fines and also owes more than a billion dollars from civil suits. Oris Paxton Van Sweringen (April 24, 1879 – November 22, 1936) and Mantis James Van Sweringen (July 8, 1881 – December 12, 1935) were American brothers who became railroad barons in order to develop Shaker Heights, Ohio. They are better known as O. P. Van Sweringen and M. J. Van Sweringen, or by their collective nickname, the Vans. The brothers came from a farming area near Wooster, Ohio. Their father was for a time an engineer in the oil fields of Pennsylvania, fought in the Civil War and was wounded at the Battle of Gettysburg. The family moved to Cleveland, Ohio, in about 1890. Neither brother married; the two shared a common bedroom in their 54-room mansion, Roundwood Manor, on the grounds of their estate, Daisy Hill, in Hunting Valley, Ohio. During their lifetimes, they seldom gave interviews or made appearances in public; however, when they did, it was always together.
