FOREWORD

On behalf of the entire Archives International Auctions team, it is my pleasure to welcome you to our 110th auction and our first major event of 2026. This one-day sale presents 681 carefully curated lots spanning U.S., Chinese, and worldwide banknotes; scripophily; U.S. colonial and fiscal documents; historic ephemera; and security printing material, along with additional outstanding offerings from the renowned Silverton Collection of Colorado and Western Stocks and Bonds. Many of the items featured originate from long-held private collections and estates, with a significant number making their first appearance at public auction.

The auction offers a broad and well-balanced selection across multiple collecting categories. Included are approximately 150 lots of world banknotes; 78 lots of U.S. colonial, obsolete, and early issues; more than 30 lots of U.S. small-size notes, including National Bank Notes, Federal Reserve Notes, Legal Tenders, and Silver Certificates; and over 37 lots of historic and security-printing ephemera, including traveler's checks, stamps, and postal history. The sale concludes with an impressive 370 lots of U.S. and world scripophily, with particular strength in mining, railroads, and banking and finance, highlighted by further selections from the Silverton Collection.

Among the featured highlights is an exceptional three-note specimen set from the first 1935 issue of the Bank of Canada, comprising the \$2, \$5, and \$10 English-text notes. Also offered are extremely rare National Bank of Croatia 2001 and 2002 specimen sets, including three "Top Pop" examples. Additional highlights include a striking quartet of Banco Central de México "Bono de Caja" specimen notes in 500 and 1,000 pesos; a desirable group of twelve different Louisiana and Mississippi obsolete scrip notes from an old-time collection, never previously offered at auction; and a trio of 1860s obsolete notes from The First National Oyster Bank of Monaskon, Virginia. The small-size currency section includes thirty notes, among them seven different National Bank Notes from New York. Throughout the sale are dozens of attractive banknotes, proof vignettes, production files, and security-printed sample material. Historic and security-printing ephemera ranges from railroad and advertising material to postcards, proof and specimen documents, vignettes, and related artifacts. A notable highlight is a Washington, November 16, 1863, U.S. Colored Troops Civil War officer appointment signed by Secretary of War Edwin M. Stanton. Collectors will also find an exciting and rarely offered group of Farley Special Printings, including uncut press sheets of the 1934 1¢ and 3¢ National Parks souvenir sheets, Admiral Byrd souvenir sheets, and both Chicago Century of Progress issues. These ungummed sheets, consisting of nine to twenty-five souvenir sheets per page, seldom survive intact, as many were historically cut into gutter blocks and smaller multiples.

The auction concludes with an extensive offering of automobile, banking, mining, railroad, and miscellaneous group lots. The mining section alone comprises nearly 160 lots, featuring the largest single offering of rare Western mining certificates we have ever presented, including fifteen territorial issues from Colorado, Idaho, Nevada, and Arizona, alongside sixty railroad certificates and numerous other scarce and desirable pieces.

Our 111th auction is planned for mid to late February and will feature additional selections of banknotes, scripophily, coins, ephemera, and historic bonds and shares from major estates, many unseen for decades. We are actively accepting consignments for our Winter and Spring 2026 sales.

We sincerely thank you for your continued interest and support. We hope this auction brings you both enjoyment and meaningful additions to your collection, and we wish you continued health, happiness, and success in the New Year.

KEY TO CATALOGING

DEFINITIONS

SPECIMEN: An archival printing sample of a finished item, such as a stock certificate, banknote or stamp that is printed usually with "000000" serial numbers and may have "Specimen" overprinted on it and be punch canceled to invalidate it and prevent its use surreptitiously. Specimens were kept for a number of reasons, though usually as samples to give out to prospective customers to give them an idea of the type and quality of the work that the printing company was capable of doing. Usually specimens were printed in limited amounts at the beginning of a printing run to evaluate the quality of the printing work and color combinations at an early stage, rather than have an entire production run rejected due to some minor flaw that was not found until after the printing was completed. A specimen is similar to the final product, printed on the same paper and in the same color.

COLOR TRIAL SPECIMENS: Sometimes specimens would be printed in numerous color combinations not used on the final note for evaluation before a final printing. These are usually extremely rare.

PROOF: An initial pull or impression from a plate or die for evaluation of text, vignette, engraving, and esthetic appeal and to check for any errors or faults. These were usually printed on india paper mounted on card or printed on some form of paper or light card. The amount of proofs printed is usually extremely small and usually number only a handful. Proofs allowed the printing company to evaluate the quality of the item being printed without having to go to the expense of making final plates and finding out small errors that could have been repaired at an earlier stage. Usually, proofs are single impressions of banknotes, stamps, vignettes, etc. Anything that was made into a plate, such as a sheet of 100 stamps could have had proof impressions taken from it. These would be called plate proofs (for multiple images) versus die proofs (usually of a single or small amount of images).

COLOR TRIAL PROOF: A proof printed in a color other than the issued color.

ESSAY SPECIMEN or PROOF: A proposed design that was not used but may be similar or even totally different to a final approved design. An artist, engraver or company may have proposed a number of different designs and color combinations to a client for his approval. If a design is rejected and never used, it could be called an essay.

PRODUCTION MATERIAL: Material found in files used in the production of security printed documents, banknotes, stamps and such. It may include correspondence, photographs, artwork, and signature samples, samples of other printed items that are marked up with corrections as well as proofs, specimens, essays, models, mockups and issued final items.

MODEL: A proposed or final design that may include original artwork, pieces of design elements such as borders, titles, vignettes, corporate seals, undertints and possibly portions of photographs. Before an engraved item was made, a design had to be decided on. This portion of the design process allowed for the artistic skills of the engraver or design department to be exhibited. Before the" digital age", banknote engravers and designers would cut up portions of other engraved items and re-apply them in a different form or design to come up with a unique new stamp, banknote or certificate. Often, all new engravings or "vignettes" of people or scenes would be engraved first to include in the new "work of art", and other times, portions of different completed items would be "borrowed" to use on a newly designed item. All models are rare and almost all of them are unique.

Canada, 1935. An exceptional three-note specimen group from the first issue of the Bank of Canada, comprising the \$2, \$5, and \$10 English-text Specimen Banknotes, produced at the founding of Canada's central banking system. Issued to mark the 1935 transition from chartered bank notes to a unified national currency, these specimens represent a cornerstone moment in Canadian monetary history. All three notes are in Choice Uncirculated condition, with excellent centering, strong eye appeal, and crisp original paper. Offered together, the group forms a highly desirable and historically important trio from the inaugural Bank of Canada series.







U.S. Colored Troops Civil War Officer Appointment, Official War Department printed and manuscript-completed appointment issued during the critical early months of the Union Army's expansion of African American regiments, signed by Secretary of War Edwin M. Stanton. This historic War Department printed and manuscript-completed appointment commissions a Captain in the 7th Regiment, U.S. Colored Troops, to rank from November 14, 1863, with orders to report for duty in Frederick, Maryland under the authority of the Middle Department, the Union military district overseeing Maryland and surrounding areas. Created during the rapid mobilization of African American regiments following the Emancipation Proclamation, early U.S.C.T. commissions such as this are among the most significant administrative acts of the Civil War. The document bears the bold signature of Secretary of War Edwin M. The identity of the officer remains unknown due to a clerical error in which a War Department clerk inserted the word "Captain" in the space reserved for the recipient's name—an unusual but documented mistake on early U.S.C.T. appointments. Capital was raised through bonds and shares tied to anticipated land development, settlement revenues, and trade, rather than direct state sponsorship. Like many early 19th-century colonization ventures, the enterprise faced practical and financial obstacles, including over-optimistic projections and logistical difficulties, resulting in a relatively short operational life. Issued bonds are notably scarcer than promotional material or unissued examples, as many were redeemed, cancelled, or discarded following restructuring or failure. This piece stands as a tangible record of early international land speculation and the transition from imperial colonization to privately financed overseas development during the formative period of moder
